How to assess the problems

- · List the Student's current equipment
 - 1. The computer itself (PC or Mac)
 - a. Brand, age, memory
 - b. Access hardware being used
 - c. Software being used
 - 2. The AAC device being used
 - a. Brand, age, memory
 - b. Access hardware being used
 - c. Software being used
 - 3. The powered chair being used
 - a. Brand, age, serial no., model no.
 - b. Access hardware being used
 - c. Auxiliary control interface availability
 - d. Remote programmer

How to assess the problems

- · List the Student's AT experience
 - 1. Student's history of use of access methods
 - a. Paired with what activity
 - b. Software used
 - c. History of success
 - 2. Student's level of independence with all activities above

How to assess the problems

- List the current problems
 - 1. A real list
 - Could include:
 - Equipment needs (doesn't have what is needed)
 - Staff support needs (not knowledgeable enough)
 - Experience needs (practice for the student)
 - Software needs (doesn't have what is needed)
 - Others

How to assess problems

- Identify the Goals
 - 1. The wish list
 - a. What would work
 - b. What could work
 - c. What might work

- 2. Where to start
- 3. Who can start

Common Problems

- 1. Incompatible equipment
- 2. Lack of Knowledge of integration by Staff and/or student
 - 3. Lack of REAL practice by student and staff
 - 4. Lack of REAL time for planning for practice and use
 - 5. Lack of REAL experience in role modeling use of equipment in tasks

Common Problems

- 6. Whose job is this? (to make things work), AT,SLP, PT, OT, Teacher, parents, personal assistant, student?
- 7. How to know about powered chairs and compatibility of equipment
